

Response and Arrival Time at Emergencies in Greenville

Average Arrival Time

On-duty Firefighters *arrived* at emergency scenes within an average 3 minutes 36 seconds from time of being dispatched.

Average "Turn Out" Time

On-duty Firefighters went enroute to emergencies within an average <u>1 minute 33 seconds</u> from time of being dispatched.

- 1. Provided and installed <u>84</u> free smoke alarm batteries for Greenville residents during our annual "Change Your Clock, Change Your Battery" Campaign in October. This service continues throughout the year.
- 2. Installed 25 free smoke detectors for residents.
- 3. Participated in 6 Borough parades.
- 4. Provided fire and rescue stand by service for 1 public event.
- 5. Physical strength conditioning and annual physical agility tests.
- 6. Answered <u>16</u> "PA One Call" after hours emergency telephone calls and notified Borough Wastewater plant employees accordingly.
- 9. On <u>4</u> occasions, the on-duty firefighters were needed to activate the emergency back-up dispatch center at our fire station at the request of Mercer County 9-1-1. This back-up center is activated when the County 9-1-1 Center down. We are the only fire station in the County that can immediately activate the county back-up dispatch center.
- 10. Also attended monthly and quarterly business and planning meetings.

TRAFFIC SIGNAL MAINTENANCE and REPAIRS

Burned out traffic/pedestrian lights were repaired by the fire chief. Ladder 96 and Ladder 96-2 were used for these repairs.

There were also call-outs to resolve traffic light controller malfunctions.

Annual preventive maintenance was performed by the fire chief on all traffic control cabinets.

PARKING LOT LIGHTS and MAIN STREET POLE LIGHTS MAINTENANCE

Street lights in the public parking lots and new light poles on Main Street were maintained and repaired by the fire chief using Ladder 96 & Ladder 96-2.

Office of Emergency Management

The Office of Emergency Management oversaw the periodic testing of the Borough's tornado warning siren, attended quarterly Emergency Management Coordinator training at the Mercer County Department of Public Safety, performed review of the Borough's Emergency Management Plans and the Greenville Water Authority's Emergency Response Plan.

Received and filed Tier II Hazardous Materials Reporting forms from fixed facilities in the Borough.

Reviewed and updated "Off-Site Emergency Response Plans" for fixed facilities in the Borough.

Maintained and exercised the emergency generator at the municipal building.

Made repairs to the electric relay at the tornado siren. Retrieved replacement parts in Oil City.

State Firefighter Relief Association Fund Uses 2013

These funds are received by the fire department from a 2% tax placed on fire insurance premiums sold in Pennsylvania by insurance companies headquartered outside of Pennsylvania. A portion of these funds helps support the firefighters pension fund and a portion is allocated to the volunteer fire company for training and safety purposes.

Through the graciousness of the members of the Greenville Volunteer Fire Company, although not obligated to do so, the following expenses were paid with these funds in 2013 which relieved the Borough from having to pay these expenses:
